

DECLARATION FOR AN ORIGINAL INVALID PENSION.

This must be Executed before a Court of Record or some Officer thereof having Custody of the Seal.

State of Massachusetts, County of Suffolk } ss.

On this fifteenth day of June A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty —
personally appeared before me Clerk of the Municipal Court of the City of Boston a Court
of Record within and for the county and State aforesaid, George H. Moulton

aged thirty six years, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical

George H. Moulton who was ENROLLED on the twenty-first day of

August 1862 in company "G" of the 38th regiment of Infantry Mass. Vols.

commanded by Capt. James H. Wade and was honorably DISCHARGED at

Savannah Ga. on the thirtieth day of June 1865 that his

personal description is as follows: Age 36 years; height 5 feet 6 1/2 inches; complexion light

hair ash-blond eyes blue That while a member of the organization aforesaid, in the

service and in the line of his duty at Camp Kenny Carrollton in the State of Louisiana

on or about the fifteenth day of January 1863 by reason of exposure in a malarial

district he contracted malarial fever complicated with disease of the kidneys and liver resulting

therefrom for which he received treatment in regimental hospital of Grand or injury. If disabled by disease, state fully its cause; if by wound or injury, the precise manner in which received.

Also that while on the march from Clinton to Port Hudson La. on or about 8th June

1863, he was sun-struck, for which he received treatment by regimental medical officer

Also that while in the line of his duty, in action, at Port Hudson, La. on or

about 14th day of June 1863 he received a gun-shot wound left side, for which

he was treated at General Field Hospital, Port Hudson, La. transferred to Madame Hall Civil

Baton Rouge La. transferred to Barracks Civil Corps Baton Rouge La.

Also that while in the line of his duty, in action, at Opequan Creek, Va. on or

about 17th September 1864, he received a gun-shot (shell) wound left ankle (outside

for which he was treated in Field Hospital Winchester, Va. sent to Civil Corps York, Penna.

transferred to Civil Corps, Readville, Mass.

That he was treated in hospitals as follows: Here state the names or numbers, and the localities of all hospitals in which treated, and the dates of treatment.

That he has never been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above. no prior

to 21st August 1862, nor subsequent to 30th June 1863. Here state what the service was, whether prior or subsequent to that stated above, and the dates at which it began and ended.

That since leaving the service this applicant has resided in the various places

in the State of Massachusetts and his occupation has been that of a clerk most of the time

That prior to his entry into the service above named he was a man of good, sound, physical health, being when enrolled a

clerk That he is now partially disabled from

obtaining his subsistence by manual labor, by reason of the disease and injuries, above described, received in the service of the

United States; and he therefore makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the invalid pension

roll of the United States. He hereby appoints with full power of substitution and revocation,

his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim. That he has never received no

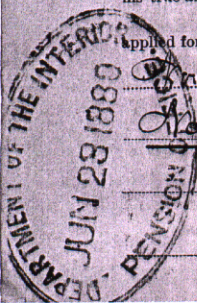

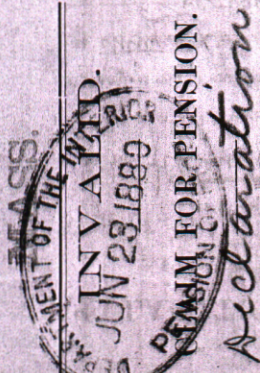

NOTES.

All the blanks in this form should be carefully filled and the requirements of the notes strictly observed.
Declarations of claimants for original pension must be made before a Court of Record, or before some officer thereof having custody of its seal; said officer being fully authorized and empowered to administer and certify any oath or affirmation relating to any pension or application therefor.
The claimant's identity must be proven by two witnesses, certified by the judicial officer to be respectable and credible, who are present and witness the signature of the declarant, and certify to his or her identity under oath or affirmation.
Declarations and other papers should be as legible and as clear in statement as possible.
Where any evidence is already on file in any Department of the Government, a definite description of and specific reference to it will render it available in any subsequent claim.
The post-office address (naming street and number in all large cities) of the applicant, attorney, and witnesses, should be embodied in or accompany every application, and all evidence in each claim; and each change of residence of said parties while communicating with the Pension Office or the pension agents should be stated.
All facts, testimony of which is required to establish a claim, must be proven by the affidavits of two or more credible witnesses, unless other evidence is specified.
Testimony, in support of allegations made in a declaration, may be taken before any officer whose authority and signature are duly certified, and who shall disclaim any interest, direct or indirect, in the prosecution of the claim.
To facilitate the adjudication of claims all the requisite evidence that is available should be forwarded with the application.
