DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

STATE OF Maine }
COUNTY OF York } ss:

On this 23rd day of June A. D. one thousand nine hundred and five
personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and
State aforesaid, Caroline S. Moulton, aged 64 years,
a resident of Wells, County of York
State of Maine, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration
in order to obtain pension under the provisions of the act of Congress approved June 27, 1890, as
amended by the act of May 9, 1900.

That she is the widow of George H. Moulton, who was
enrolled under the name of George H. Moulton
(Enrolled or commissioned.)
at Milton, Mass on the Second day of August, 18 62
as a Private in Co. I 35th Regiment Massachusetts Vol. Inf.
(Here state rank and designation of organization or name of vessel.)
and honorably discharged June 30th, 18 65, having served ninety days or more during the late war of
the rebellion. That the soldier was not in the military or naval service of the United States except as stated above.

(If any other service it should be stated in full.)

That she was married under the name of Carrie S. Rankin to said soldier
at Wells, Me on the 16th day of April, 18 67,
by Rev. Jonathan B. Cook; that there was no legal barrier to the marriage;
that she had not been previously married; that the soldier had not been previously married.

(If there was a prior marriage of either, the date and place of death or divorce of former consort or consorts should be stated.)

That the said soldier died June 8th, 1905, at Wells;
that she was not divorced from him; that she has not remarried since his death; and that she is without other
means of support than her daily labor and an actual net income not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars per year.

That the said soldier left the following named children who are now living and under sixteen years of age, to wit:

of Wells, Maine (If she desires to employ an attorney.)

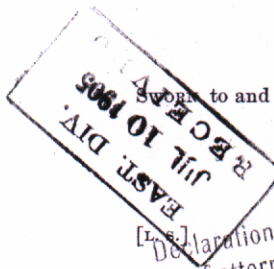

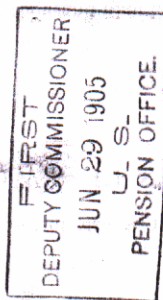
To be executed before some officer of a court of record having custody of its seal, a notary public, justice of
 the peace, or other officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. If such officer is not required by
 law to have and use a seal, his official character, signature, and term of office must be certified by the proper State,
 county, or city officer under his official seal, unless such a certificate has been filed in the Bureau of Pensions for
 general reference.

Testimony in support of allegations made in a declaration may be taken before any officer whose authority and
 signature are duly certified, and who shall disclaim any interest, direct or indirect, in the prosecution of the claim.
