on the march from Blinton Port Hudson in the State of Louisiana did, on or

further that while in the strict line of his duty, in action, at
Port Hudson La. 14th June 1863, while serving in the ranks
of his company he received a gun-shot wound in left

I further say that I have personal knowledge of all
the facts as above stated, being at the several times

commissioned officer of said Company "D"; I further
say that I was promoted to be Second Lieutenant
in said 38th Regt Inftry Mass. Vols. 26th Octo 1864,
but was never mustered on said commission

And deponent further states that he was well acquainted with the claimant, having known him for at least twenty years, and further that his knowledge of the facts above stated was derived from said acquaintance, and from having served as a noncommissioned officer of Company "D" of the Thirty eighth Regiment of Safety Mass Volunteers, from the day of August, 1864, to the day of August, 1864. And deponent further states that the claimant was a sound and able-bodied man at and prior to enlistment, so far as he knew, and that he is totally disinterested in this claim.

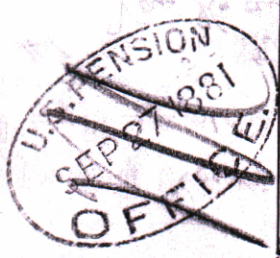
