person of that name who enlisted or volunteered as a Private in Company "D" Thirty-eighth
Regiment of Inftry, Mass. vols., and who was mustered out with the
Company at Savannah Ga on or about the 30th day of June 1865
by reason of expiration of term of service

That the said George H. Moulton while in the line of his duty, near

And deponent further states that he was well acquainted with the claimant, having known him for at least twenty years, and further that his knowledge of the facts above stated was derived from said acquaintance, and from having served as a noncommissioned officer of Company "G" of the Thirty eighth Regiment of Infantry Mass Volunteers, from the day of its whole term of service, 186 to the day of 186. And deponent further states that the claimant was a sound and able-bodied man at and prior to enlistment, so far as he knew, and that he is totally disinterested in this claim.


