

NORFOLK DEEDS.

36:51. I, Daniel Thomas Vose of Milton, County of Norfolk, Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Gentleman, in consideration of a certain bond or obligatory writing made by my late honoured father to my late sister Patience Holbrook & her heirs & also in consideration of the obligations imposed on me by my late father in his last will and testament as also in consideration of one cent to me paid by Clarissa Gardner, wife of Henry Gardner of Dorchester in the county aforesaid and sole heir to the said Patience, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, sell and convey unto the said Clarissa Gardner, her heirs and assigns forever, a certain piece or parcel of land situated in said Milton & bounded as follows: beginning at the Northwesterly corner of land lately the property of Daniel Vose, deceased, and running northerly one chain and sixty-two links on the Road leading from Quincy to Milton lower bridge, then running easterly one chain and fifty-four links on lands now in occupation of Mr. Edmund Baker, then running southerly one chain and seventy-one links on land lately the property of Daniel Vose, deceased, then running westerly on land belonging to said deceased one chain and seventy-two links to the aforesaid Road, containing as by the plan lately taken pr. Mather Withington, surv<sup>r</sup>. one-quarter of an acre and three rods it being the same property which was lately in the possession of Henry M. Lisle & the same which Jeremiah Smith conveyed to me the said Daniel Thomas Vose with the houses, privileges & appurtenances thereunto belonging.
